Printable toolkit: what to expect, what to save, and how to avoid proof gaps.

First 72 Hours Checklist

- Photograph both vehicles from all angles
- Photograph the signal, lanes, and skid marks
- Collect witness names and contact info
- Write down what you remember (time + sequence)
- Save dashcam clips and phone photos to the cloud
- Keep tow and repair paperwork in one folder

Adjuster-Pressure Guardrails

- Stick to facts you personally know; avoid guessing speed or distance.
- Do not sign broad medical or liability releases without review.
- If symptoms evolve, document changes and keep appointments consistent.
- Ask for the claim number and confirm key details in writing.

Where Key Records Often Live

- Crash report and photos (Louisiana State Police site or responding agency)
- Traffic camera or nearby business footage (often overwritten quickly)
- Vehicle repair estimates, supplements, and replaced parts
- Event data recorder (EDR) or airbag module data (vehicle-dependent)

Rear-End Stop-Light Evidence Blueprint

5 steps + a 72-hour list

1 Lock In Scene Proof
Photos of both cars
Signal, lanes, marks
Witnesses + cameras

2 Pin The Timeline
Exact time + route
Report number + agency
Tow + storage location

3 Document Symptoms
First visit notes
Daily symptom log
Work / activity limits

4 Preserve Vehicle Data
Dashcam + phone files
Repair estimate + parts
Ask about EDR access

5 Control The Claim File
Facts, not guesses
Avoid broad releases
Save receipts + wages

Rear-End Claims: Defense Vs Evidence

Close proof gaps early

Defense Angle	Evidence Anchor
You Stopped Short Signal timing, lane position photos, witness statements	Scene Timeline Photos + notes show a normal stop and the impact sequence
Low Impact, No Injury Early care notes + consistent follow-up and function limits	Medical Timeline Symptoms tracked against daily tasks and work demands
No Damage, No Force Repair estimate, hidden damage photos, parts kept	Vehicle Proof Photos + estimates show crush and post-impact repair
You Are Fine Now Gaps explained, work notes, ongoing limits	Function Record A simple daily log connects pain to real-world tasks
