

Mesothelioma Diagnosis and Treatment Options

Printable Toolkit: What to Do, What to Save, What to Ask

Quick Takeaways

- Diagnosis first: ask for the full biopsy and pathology report so the exact type is clear.
- Treatment planning starts with staging and a coordinated care team, not a single test result.
- Build one folder that holds records, appointment notes, and a simple exposure timeline.
- Non-medical proof matters: write down job sites, product memories, and coworker names early.

Checklists for Your First Appointments

Use these lists to reduce paperwork gaps and preserve key records

Doctor-Visit Checklist

- Ask for the exact mesothelioma type and location (pleural vs peritoneal), and whether staging is complete.
- Request copies of imaging reports (CT, PET, MRI) and lab/pathology results as a single download or print packet.
- Write down treatment options discussed (surgery, chemo, radiation, immunotherapy, targeted therapy) and the goal of each.
- Bring a one-page medication list and a symptom log so side effects are documented clearly.

Asbestos Exposure & Records Checklist

- Make a work-history list with employers, job titles, job sites, and years (even if you do not remember product names yet).
- List any insulation, pipe covering, boilers, flooring, brake work, or other dusty tasks you handled or worked near.
- Collect payroll records (W-2s, stubs), union records, and any old training materials or safety manuals you still have.
- Write down coworker names and supervisors who can confirm job duties and products used.

First 72 Hours: Small Wins

- Request records and imaging reports.
- Write the exposure list while it is fresh.
- Save bills, travel receipts, and photos.
