

What Are the Different Types of Mesothelioma?

Pleural, Peritoneal, Pericardial, Testicular + Cell Types

At A Glance: Types By Location

- Pleural: starts in the lining around the lungs (most common).
- Peritoneal: starts in the lining of the abdomen.
- Pericardial: starts in the lining around the heart (rare).
- Testicular (tunica vaginalis): starts in tissue around the testicles (rare).

Key Records To Request (Ask For Copies)

Record	Why It Matters
Pathology report	Shows location and cell type in writing.
Imaging reports	Shows what was seen and when (CT, PET, X-ray).
Operative notes	Explains what tissue was sampled and where.
Exposure notes	Work history and product details connect exposure to site.

Questions To Ask Your Doctor

- What location type is it (pleural, peritoneal, etc.)?
- What cell type is it (epithelioid, sarcomatoid, biphasic)?
- What tests confirm the diagnosis (biopsy type and stains)?
- Where should follow-up imaging focus next?

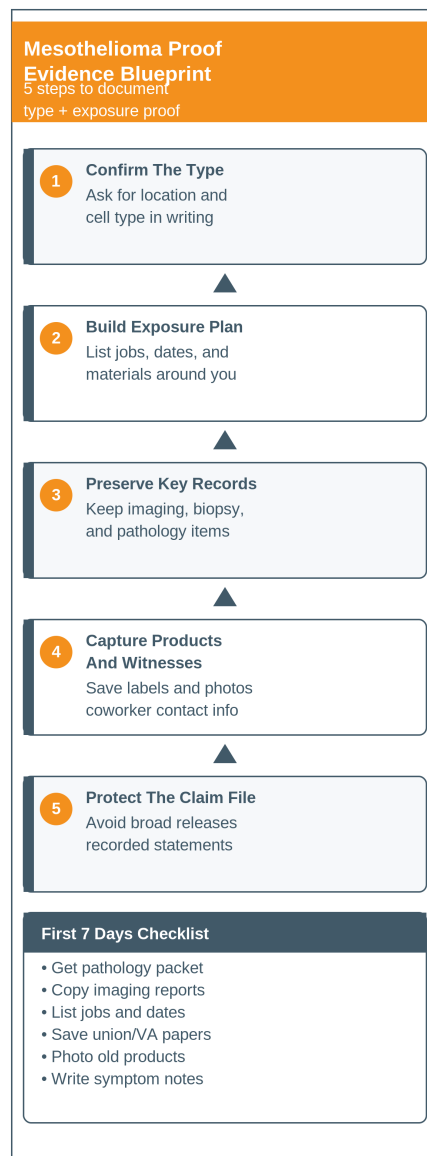
Documentation Checklist (For Your Case File)

- A one-page timeline of jobs, dates, and job sites (even if approximate).
- Names and phone numbers for coworkers or supervisors who can confirm materials used.
- Photos of old tools, insulation, gaskets, brakes, or packaging you still have access to.
- Copies of union cards, pay stubs, W-2s, or VA-related records that help place you at a site.
- A running symptom journal with dates (shortness of breath, pain, fatigue, abdominal swelling).
